THE WORKSHOP: Sue will bring the two quilts featured here and you will choose one of them to recreate in your own colors. She doesn't offer patterns but will show you just how easy it is to make flowers and leaves. The quilt building portion of the workshop will be followed by ample time to play with paints and pencils; Sue will show you how to apply them to your quilt to create a three dimensional look to your work. The finished size of each quilt will be approx. 12" x 16". The paints and pencils will be supplied by the instructor at a cost of \$2 payable the day of the workshop.

THE ARTIST: *Sue Holdaway-Heys* is a professional quilt artist from Ann Arbor, Michigan. Her work has been shown in many prestigious shows, she has won many awards and she has been published many times. Sue's work has been featured at the American Quilt Society Show, The Ella Sharpe Museum, and The Ann Arbor Art Center. Her work is represented in many public and private collections including a doll in the White House collection.
